- Make mission and goals explicit in objectives and learning experiences.
- Support proposal writing and program evaluation reporting for external funding.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Master's degree (preferred) in curriculum, instruction, community education, or related field.
- Experience in curriculum and instructional design, community and youth advocacy, K-12 teaching
 experience (in or outside of traditional classroom knowledge and application of current on
 research related to multicultural, anti-racist, inclusive, and social justice education, especially
 infusion of African American history and context into K-12 education, authentic, meaningful
 experiences with African American youth and African American communities), adult professional
 learning or training, program evaluation.
- Enthusiastic and coherent communicator.
- Evidence of a strong work ethic and organizational skills.
